Caelum wins SeaPort-e bid

Rockville, Maryland – June 1, 2005. Caelum and its 14-company team are among the winners of the U.S. Navy's SeaPort-e Multiple Award Contract. The contract covers all support services for all phases of weapon systems acquisition and life-cycle support including, Research & Development Support, Prototyping, Acquisition Logistics, Modeling, Test & Evaluation Trials, and Engineering Support for the Naval Sea Systems Command, Naval Air Systems Command, Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command, Naval Supply Systems Command, Military Sealift Command, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Strategic Systems Programs, and the United States Marine Corps. The Government estimates a maximum of \$5,300,000,000 of services will be procured per year via orders issued under the SeaPort Enhanced (SeaPort-e) multiple award contracts.

The awards have a four-year base period with one five-year award term and one additional one-year award term. As a contract vehicle there are no guaranteed sales and the companies must pursue each opportunity individually.

The Caelum Team proposed services in three regions—National Capital, Gulf Coast and Southwest.
